New Labour-led coalition announces housing policy



Community Housing Aotearoa welcomes the new Labour-led coalition Government and our message is - we are ready to partner with you.

In our press release sent out last week we congratulated Phil Twyford in his new role as Minister of Housing and Urban Development and Carmel Sepuloni as Minister for Social Development. They are joined by Jenny Salesa as Minister for Building and Construction and Associate Minister of Housing and Urban Development.

The new Government have ambitious goals in the housing area and we want to work with them. We think that New Zealand will achieve these goals more quickly when community housing providers and Housing New Zealand both have access to similar investment tools. Building our sector to 2030 – seminar 24 October

Community Housing sector leaders met on 24 October 2017 to build consensus on the settings that would increase supply of social and affordable housing and working toward 'all New Zealanders well-housed by 2030'.

We heard from Alan Johnson, Salvation Army Social Policy and Research Unit, on the Taking Stock report he produced earlier in the year, with discussion facilitated by Kay Saville-Smith of CRESA. Consensus was reached on the goal and the settings necessary to build the sector. These high-level consensus points would see annual delivery goals through to at least 2030 in the areas of funding, land, regulation and procurement.

Consensus points have been summarised into a document on this page <u>here</u>, and Alan Johnson's presentation about the current social housing stock available in New Zealand and the projected need can be viewed in a video on the same page.

It was set up to provide us with a delivery arm for services to individual members and community housing organisations which are beyond the scope of normal peak body services. Queenstown Lakes Mayoral Housing Affordability Taskforce



Queenstown lakes District Council has accepted the recommendations proposed by a mayoral taskforce including building a portfolio of secure long-term rental options, changes to visitor accommodation such as Airbnb, changes to zoning and intensification regulations, addressing household income support with central Government and building a long-term housing strategy for the district with a stronger, scaled up Queenstown Lakes Community Housing Trust (QLCHT).

The Queenstown Lakes District would become the first in New Zealand to deliver an affordable housing scheme known as Secure Homes. Taskforce chairman John MacDonald said the model would see the land and house value split with the land being rented to the home owner. The land would stay in community ownership in perpetuity and the value of the house would be capped at a CPI rate.

"If people want to move out or trade to another house in the market then that gets offered back to approved buyers."

Scott Figenshow, who worked with the taskforce to develop the report, says the Council have been innovative and courageous in their adoption of a transformative plan that will see change in the supply of affordable housing in the area. He says this strategy exemplifies partnership from a local council that builds the capacity and delivery through a community housing organisation, Queenstown Lakes Community Housing Trust, and private sector partners.

"The new Government should target new housing and employment on un-zoned land along the rail line through Paerata to meet Auckland's growth challenge," says Stephen Selwood, CEO of Infrastructure New Zealand.

"Our latest report released last week examines the cost of growth in different greenfield areas around the city where land is accessible and non-sensitive and finds Paerata to be the best on balance for major new development. Stephen Selwood says it is cheaper to service with water, energy and transport and strategically located near to employment. Read more here.
