Introduction

AHI Professional Excellence in Housing Awards

The Australasian Housing Institute Awards provide an opportunity to showcase social housing success stories. The Awards formally recognise and reward excellence in professional practice, from the grass roots to the most senior levels. They promote to our colleagues and the community at large the difference that social housing professionals make to people's lives.

The Institute has run an awards program since 2004. This program has become increasingly popular with members and other housing professionals. The National Award Winners will be announced during the National Housing Conference 2015 in Perth and a ceremony will be held after the Conference welcome reception on the 28th October 2015.

Awards will go to housing professionals who are judged to have made a significant and lasting difference: to tenants or service users, to their community, to their colleagues and to their profession. The Awards recognise the contributions and achievements of our colleagues in the many disciplines which make up the housing profession.

WHY ENTER THE AWARDS?

The AHI Professional Excellence in Housing Awards provides the social housing sector with a platform to recognise and reward those who dedicate their career for the benefit of their community. Providing recognition for these outstanding achievements helps inspire others in developing a vibrant social housing profession.

The awards are free to enter and provide entrants with the opportunity:

- To reward great work and achievements by individuals and teams
- To recognise best practice and high standards of service
- To promote and celebrate innovation
- To develop and increase the profile of our profession







2015 Award Categories

The 2015 AHI Awards feature eight categories:

- 2 individual awards, which recognises achievements of individuals who have made an outstanding contribution to the housing sector
- 5 team awards, which are open to housing organisations or project teams, and
- the Tenant Award which is aimed at an individual or a group of residents or tenants who have undertaken a project or initiative to benefit others in their community.

The project or initiative may be applied to **no more than two categories**, please determine this in the Entry Form.

Selection Criteria

Awards will go to housing professionals who are judged to have made a significant and lasting difference: to tenants or service users, to their community, to their colleagues and to their profession. Each nomination will be judged against the following criteria:

- The extent to which the person, group or team has reflected the intent expressed in the category descriptor
- Evidence of sustainable benefits for the community, the environment or the workplace
- Ideas that are transferable and can be adapted for use in other places and settings
- The achievement of excellence in practice through the application of strategic thinking, innovation, consistently high standards and/or continuous improvement of the tenant / customer experience and themselves.

Individual Awards

Outstanding Achievement

The winning candidate will be a housing professional who has made a strong impact on social housing, their work will demonstrate the enormous difference one person can make to the profession, a place or an issue.

Inspirational Team Member

The winning candidate will be a person who consistently shows a willingness to add value over and above their official role, and who motivates others by the approach they take to their work.

Tenant Award

Tenant Led Initiative

Individual or a group of residents/tenants who have undertaken a project or initiative to benefit others in their community. Their project or initiative will have achieved real outcomes and has inputs and outputs that are self-sustaining.

Excellence in Social Housing

An organisation that shows excellence in the provision of social housing by going beyond the expected as well as showing initiative and courage.

Leading Innovation

Initiatives or projects that have led to significant change in their own organisation or community, with lessons that could be applied more broadly to other housing organisations.

Leading Housing Development Project

Residential development that increases the quality of life for its tenants.

Team Awards

Leading Asset Management

A service that is consistently rated by tenants and stakeholders as excellent and/or has elements of a new way of asset management that reduces waiting times and costs.

Leading Tenants Engagement Practice

A project or initiative that supports and enables tenant engagement in the community, particularly where there was disengagement before, that stands out, empowers and brings tenants into the decision making process.







Rules & Conditions

Eligibility

Everyone who works in the housing sector, whether in a paid or volunteer role, is eligible for entry. However, the person submitting the nomination **must be a member of AHI**.

Nominating

Entries must be submitted on the prescribed <u>Nomination Form</u> and returned to the AHI office via e-mail admin@ housinginstitute.org. Applications submitted by mail or fax will not be accepted. All sections to be printed. We do not accept applications in handwriting. All sections of this form must be completed for the nomination to be valid

Judging

Judges will have complete discretion in assessing entries, applying the judging criteria, conditions of entry and determining the awards. The **decision of the judges is final** and no correspondence will be entered into. The Australasian Housing Institute judging panel reserves the right not to allocate winners in a particular category.

Cost

There is **no cost** to enter the AHI Awards, however the Award Receptions are ticketed events.

After nominations close on the 28th of February 2015, the Judging Panel will be reviewing the nominations during March and April.

A category winner will be selected in each Australian jurisdiction and in New Zealand. State Awards receptions will be held in SA, WA and New Zealand. Joint Awards receptions will be held for ACT/NSW, QLD/NT and VIC/TAS.



Finalists from each jurisdiction will automatically be entered in the Australasian Awards. The National Award Winners will then be announced during the National Housing Conference 2015 in Perth and a ceremony will be held after the Conference welcome reception on the 28th October 2015.
