# Meet the people working in community housing – Brook Turner from Vision West



Brook Turner is the head of community service development at Vision West in West Auckland. He's dedicated 20 years of his life to community development and joined community housing provider Vision West this year.

"Vision West has a range of housing services that support people in the community in different ways. This includes 50 long-term social houses. They also run six emergency houses supporting up to 24 families a year. Our Housing First service aims to house 112 families in the next two years with 16 households housed so far. We are aiming to house 56 chronically homeless families by the end of January."

## Rotorua Lakes Council opens Request for Expressions of Interest to provide and develop pensioner housing

Rotorua Lakes Council currently manages 152 pensioner units located across five Rotorua sites.

The Council is keen to identify models of operating the pensioner housing asset through a registered community housing provider (CHP).

- to ensure a financially viable and sustainable future for the provision of pensioner social housing
- to provide greater support services for vulnerable tenants
- to optimise central government grants, allowances or other funds which support social housing tenants and social housing development
- to attract investment to improve the current assets ·
- to attract investment to grow the asset for the provision of pensioner, other social or affordable housing.

The current tenancies must continue to be supported in any future change of managment. The REOI is available through <u>Tenderlink</u> <u>here</u> to view the documents and register your interest for RDC-783994 which closes on 27 October.

# Community Housing Supply Survey update

We'd like to share the results for the quarter ending June 2017 of the Community Housing Supply Survey with you. This project has now been running for a year and is showing us a dynamic view of the sector.

As at 30 June, 39 organisations have responded to the survey reporting on 9,834 homes and with an occupancy rate at 94%. The homes surveyed are providing primarily long-term rental accommodation at 85% with 6% in shared ownership programs, 6% rent-to-buy, and a small number of emergency and transitional homes.

We estimate that the community housing stock exceeds 13,000 and we would like to get closer to reporting on this mark for the September 30 quarter. It is an important step towards having a better understood and provided for community housing sector. Please contact Jordan here\_and you can read the full report here.

## How Finland ended homelessness



While New Zealand struggles with a lack of affordable homes, one Nordic country has come up with a permanent solution. In the last ten years, Finland has provided 16,300 permanent low-cost flats to homeless people.

A recent report by European Union housing organisation FEANTSA found every country in the EU is in the midst of a crisis of homelessness and housing exclusion, with one exception – Finland. There, the Government, local councils and NGOs are working

together on a 'housing first' strategy to end homelessness, instead of managing it.
