Gateway 2 Application for Funding now available

Andrew Plant, General Manager Strategic Purchasing HUD, wrote to tell us that the new Strategic Partnering Gateway 2 Application for New Supply Funding is now available on the <u>HUD website</u>.

Andrew informed organisations who responded to the Invitation to Partner: Since you are part of our Strategic Partner Panel, you can now submit proposals to us for evaluation at any time. I also recommend that you continue to engage with my New Supply Team to progress any new public housing opportunities.

We will be evaluating new proposals through a detailed Value for Money framework, which is based on:

- ability to deliver there's capacity and capability to deliver and add value
- fit for purpose the new housing/service is the right type in the right place to meet demand
- financial viability the project/scheme is financially viable for the contract period
- price the proposal compares well against industry benchmarks and offers value for money.

Once approved, proposals then move to the contracting phase.

Attention all emergency housing providers

We were contacted by Home Direct who asked us to provide address information for emergency housing providers' properties. We explained that we can't pass that information on to a third party but that we would pass their request on to the sector. You may have seen an article about Home Direct in our 26 November 2018 newsletter.

Home Direct wants this information to update their database to **prevent their mobile vans from visiting your sites**. If you want to exclude your properties from being visited and your clients sold goods by Home Direct, you will need to contact them directly.

Insulation in rental homes – video information for non-English-speakers



Tenancy Services has important information they want to share with non-English-speaking communities in New Zealand.

All landlords must have insulated their rental properties to the right standard by 1 July 2019, or they could pay penalties of up to \$4,000 per property.

It's really important to Tenancy Services that non-English-speaking landlords and tenants living in New Zealand are aware of this information so they don't get caught out.

They've produced a 15 second video which is subtitled in 15 languages, besides English, to help people understand what they need to do.
