Mandatory Inclusionary Zoning

Proposed Australian National Framework – Webinar Available

CHA hosted webinar on 8 June with Wendy Hayhurst, CEO, CHIA and Dr. Ryan Van de Noulewant, Geography, Tourism & Planning, Western Sydney University on our Australian counterparts work on inclusionary zoning. We learned about the participatory planning work that has yielded the set of seven common principles for their framework. The principles include agreement that at least 10% of all housing floorspace (or commensurate land / cash) developed on privately owned land should be designated, in perpetuity, as social or affordable rental housing, under community housing provider (CHP) management. It was reassuring to hear their evidence that CHPs are the most experienced and best placed to manage this housing resource into the future. Thank you to Wendy and Ryan for sharing your knowledge with our central and local government colleagues, our members and others interested in this planning tool.

What Would A New Zealand Version Look Like?

To further the discussion on what an enabling framework for New Zealand could look like, Community Housing Solutions (CHS) has released the following report:

"Enabling Inclusionary Zoning: What can we learn from the repealed Affordable Housing Enabling Territorial Authorities Act of 2008?"

The report by CHS' Chris Glaudel and Scott Figenshow gives the history of this piece of legislation enacted by the Helen Clark government. Unfortunately it was one of the first pieces of legislation repealed by the incoming National government. The report argues that there are many aspects that could fast-track the implementation of Inclusionary Zoning in New Zealand by providing clear enablement to local government.

The paper has also been shared with Ministers Parker and Twyford and with colleagues at MFE and HUD. It is hoped that Inclusionary Zoning will be enabled in the upcoming exposure draft of the resource management reforms.

Community Finance Are Finalists in Mindful Money Awards

Community Finance has been named as a finalist for Best Impact Investment Fund in Mindful Money's inaugural ethical and impact investment awards.

The awards acknowledge best practice standards in ethical investment in New Zealand. 48 entries were received across seven different award categories and will be judged by 25 independent experts. The awards ceremony takes place in Auckland on Tuesday 29 June.

Prime Minister Attends Salvation Army Opening of Westgate - Te Manaaki Tangata, and Flatbush - Kaitiakitanga Community Housing



The Salvation Army held their official opening of the Westgate - Te Manaaki Tangata, and Flatbush - Kaitiakitanga, social housing communities in Auckland. Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern and the Minister of Housing Megan Woods opened the two newly built developments.

The developments will provide much needed homes for people with severe housing need and are designed to foster supportive communities. All of the houses are energy efficient with whānaucentred design and tenancy management. Tenants also have the ongoing support of Salvation Army services designed to strengthen relationships and encourage whanaungatanga.
