Ōtautahi Community Housing Trust celebrates opening

Congratulations to the Ōtautahi Community Housing Trust, which has opened a new community housing complex in Christchurch.

The 28 one and two-bedroom home complex in Tiwaiwaka Lane (previously Cresselly Place), St Martins, was opened by Housing Minister Megan Woods and Mayor Lianne Dalziel.

The homes were designed and built to be warm and efficient, with a reduced environmental impact.

"The opening of the complex at Tiwaiwaka Lane is another step in our commitment to building great homes and creating connected communities with housing that exceeds standards," says OCHT Chief Executive Cate Kearney in this article.

And in this Stuff article, one of the new tenants talks about what it means to finally be able to provide a good home for her young daughter. Kathryn Harris says they've been in emergency housing for a few months and prior to that, stayed with other people.

"I suffer from depression, and I was getting very down," she says in the article. "I was most stressed that my daughter didn't have a stable home. But as soon as I was offered one of the new Ōtautahi houses a month ago, all my depression left me. Now I have a permanent home I'll be able to enrol Amelia in pre-school."

Public housing assessments: update

The Ministry of Social Development (MSD) advises that its full public housing needs assessment service is back up and running from 1 July.

During the COVID-19 response, MSD limited public housing needs assessments to people in emergency housing only in order to focus resources where they were most urgently needed.

The service is now available again to a wider group of people who may be under housing stress. The assessment is the first step to see if someone may qualify for public housing and can go on the housing register, based on their level of need.

To request a public housing needs assessment, people can phone MSD on 0800 559 009 and a case manager will call them back.
